Epstein's life and work is full of the challenges he experienced. From illness as a child, through controversy after controversy over the style and themes of his work in conservative Edwardian London, the fact that he was unable to remain faithful in his marriage, lost two children to mental health issues and consistently challenged both the art establishment due to his use of non-western imagery as well as the advante gard over his preference for figurative over abstract. And of course, being of Jewish descent, his abandonment of the rigid orthodoxy in which he was brought up in, led to inner turmoil which can often be seen in his work, but most especially in Jacob and the Angel.
